

Biosecurity Program

Biosecurity has become a major concern to the agriculture industry and it is important to us. Our current protocol exceeds industry standards and is intended to reduce the risk of exposure and transmittance of diseases to agribusiness facilities.

Technician must ensure they meet or exceed the protocol and must at all times respect the biosecurity protocols established by the individual livestock operation.

- Visits to farms are by appointment only
- Technicians will not visit a farm where there is a known disease outbreak in progress
- Technicians will not visit any other facilities that house livestock on the day of their visit to your facilities unless agreed upon by you
- Technicians will not visit more than one farm risk with like species considered as confined livestock without minimum 5 day interval
- Technicians will be prepared to accept all reasonable directives from the member to prevent spread of disease and follow the more stringent policy
- Technicians will take all necessary precautions to arrive with clean decontaminated equipment such as (but not limited to) vehicle, thermal imaging camera, digital cameras, measuring devices, clipboards, writing instruments, etcetera...
- Technicians will arrive personally clean with clean clothing, outerwear, boots, and personal protective equipment
- Disposable items used such as coveralls and booties are to be left onsite to be disposed of by yourself
